Dear campus community,

A coyote has been reported in various areas of campus, and UCI Police, Environmental Health & Safety, and Irvine Animal Control are aware of the situation. Animal control officers have responded to campus multiple times in recent weeks but have been unable to safely approach the animal before it runs away.

Animal control officials have indicated that the coyote does not appear to be ill. They have also advised that the hair loss and skin condition observed on the animal, commonly referred to as mange, is common among wildlife and is not contagious to humans.

Out of an abundance of caution, we ask that you do not approach, feed, attempt to medically treat, or take pictures with the coyote. These actions may cause the coyote to react unpredictably. Please keep your distance. If the coyote displays aggressive behavior or poses an immediate threat to people nearby, call 9-1-1.
